Thurston Conservation District May 2022 Financial Notes



The WA State Auditor's 2021 Annual Report was submitted on May 16 – two weeks early. This is a huge and complicated report that all WA State agencies must file with the Office of the Washington State Auditor each year. This was Yan's first time completing the report. Not only did she do a great job calculating all of the figures and pulling together all of the documents, but she reorganized the District's Chart of Accounts to match the WA State Budgeting, Accounting and Reporting System (BARS). This work was long overdue and will make it easier to file future reports. Thank you, Yan!

Total (Restricted and Unrestricted) Year-to-Date (YTD) and April Profit and Loss

- 1. You'll notice that the 3 Profit & Loss Reports look a bit different this month especially the income section of the report. This is due to the changes to the District's Chart of Accounts to align with the WA State BARS.
 - Essentially, the income categories are all the same as they were in the old format; they are just organized a bit differently. The one main difference might be in the *Nongovernmental Contributions* section. *Private Contributions* are non-governmental funds with no specific spending or reporting requirements. *Non-Governmental Grants* are funds from private organizations with special program, spending, and reporting requirements.
- 2. In April, we reported the 1st big Rates & Charges payment for 2022 \$220,263. This means that we are reporting a Year-to-Date net income of \$66,818.13.

Profit & Loss Prev Year Comparison

- 3. As reported previously, the large increase in *Private Contributions* is a result of finding and tapping into "One-Tree Planted" funds that reimburse individuals and organizations \$1 for every tree planted.
- 4. The increase in *Equipment Leases* is due to leasing on-site project equipment for the landscaping crews like refrigerated cold-storage trailers for plants and porta-potties for people. These expenses are grant-funded.
- 5. The *Staff Conference & Training* account is showing an increase over last year because staff have been able to participate in more conferences as the pandemic recedes and because a number of staff have registered to participate in WADE this year. Many of the WADE registrations are being covered by grant funds.

Balance Sheet

6. You'll notice that the Reserve Fund Savings account balance is lower than last month. This is because of the loan made to the Checking account on April 7 to cover cash flow until the Rates & Charges payment came in. You will see the repayment of that loan on May 10 in next month's Balance Sheet.

Unrestricted Budget

7. The higher rate of spending for the *Computer Software* account (89.9%) is because many of the District's annual software subscription payments were made in March and April – Zoom (\$1,081.89), DocuSign (\$656.40) and SmartSheet (\$3,525.97). Now that the subscriptions are paid, the rate of spending should

slow.

However, in May, District staff were required to migrate from Microsoft Office 10 to Microsoft 365, which is a monthly paid subscription. This expense was not included in the 2022 Unrestricted Budget so we will need to revisit the *Computer Software* account budget as part of the Mid-Year Budget Revision process.

8. The higher rate of spending for *Postage & Shipping* is due to the record number of soil testing requests – which seem to be slowing for the summer.

Open Public Meetings Act (OPMA) Updates - 2022

Emergency proclamations made by Governor Jay Inslee during the COVID 19 pandemic concerning the OPMA will expire on June $1^{\rm st}$, 2022. In addition, the legislature provided several updates to the OPMA during the 2022 legislative session, which will go into effect upon the expiration of the emergency proclamation. Many of the legislative updates have been best practices that are already in place at TCD.

The following includes new changes that will affect TCD's public meetings.

Beginning June 1st, 2022:

- Public meetings are no longer *required* to be held virtually.
- Members of the public must be given the opportunity to attend public meetings in person or virtually this means hybrid meetings will become the new norm. There are provisions and justification requirements in place if the organization deems it unfeasible to hold a virtual meeting, or unsafe to hold an in-person meeting.
 - All members of a governing body may attend public meetings virtually if organizational policies allow. (TCD Policy 1.2.1 Board Supervisor Remote Attendance allows for this and is listed for work session discussion and revision at the May Board Work Session.)

TCD staff are working to ensure sufficient technology is in place to conduct an efficient and comfortable hybrid public meeting format for the June Board Meeting. Staff will be present in the office to allow a physical meeting location for members of the public.
